#### Absences

Arriving late not only interrupts the class but can also add extra stress and anxiety to your child as they try to get caught up. Our teachers would appreciate your best efforts to ensure your child arrives on time each day.

### Vision Screening

A Lions Club Vision Screener Letter has been sent home to all parents of children in Kindergarten, Grade 3, and Grade 6. It is established that 1 in every 15 children has a vision problem and the numbers appear to be increasing with increased screen time on computers and electronic devices. Using a Welsh Allyn SPOT Vision Screener, the portable device detects six different visual discrepancies a child may have and will then be confidentially referred to see an optometrist. Please make sure you read the letter and if you would not like your child to participate, sign and return it to the office no later than April 14<sup>th</sup>.
